# What support do people in Scotland want when facing an emergency?

All figures in this briefing, unless otherwise noted, are based on 423 people living in Scotland who took part in a nationally representative online survey of 5,008 adults (18+) across the UK.


of people in Scotland think they're likely to be affected by an emergency such as flood, terror attack or severe storm at home.

don't have an emergency or alert app.






believe that emergency responders\* monitor social media for people needing help in an emergency.
