Eight 40 minute curricular lessons based around the *CBBC Operation Ouch! World War I Special* film suitable for 9-11 year olds.

Subject	Lesson	Links to National Curriculum for Northern Ireland
Lesson 1: Introduction to film	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> > World War I Operation Ouch! Film > English slang 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> > History: Become aware that there were reasons/causes why people in the past acted as they did and there were also consequences of those actions. > French: Experiment with rhymes, rhythms, verse structure and all kinds of word play and dialect.
Lesson 2: History	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> > Background and Key facts on World War I > Letter writing to make connections 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> > Develop their memories by recalling and restructuring experiences and stories from the past, for example, begin to describe/retell what life was like for older people they know using a wide range of evidence ,including, pictures, stories, photographs, artefacts, site visit and oral accounts. > Examine evidence, make links between possible causes and effects and draw conclusions from a range of factual information, > Become aware that there were reasons/causes why people in the past acted as they did and there were also consequences of those actions.
Lesson 3: PMDU	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> > First aid > Improvisation and making do 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> > Causes of conflict and appropriate responses. > Human rights and social responsibility.
Lesson 4: Physical Education	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> > Rob the trench and Bacteria ball 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> > Improve their skills of handling, hitting and kicking using a variety of equipment and progress from developing individual skills and partner activities and games to suitable small-sided adapted and mini games through both co-operative and then competitive play. > Develop control in running, jumping, changing speed, stopping and starting, with and without small equipment.
Lesson 5: Literacy	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> > Poetry 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> > Listen and respond to a range of fiction, poetry, drama and media texts through the use of traditional and digital resource. > Express thoughts, feelings and opinions in imaginative and factual writing.
Lesson 6: Science	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> > Sound waves 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> > The causes and effect of energy, forces and movement. > How movement can be accelerated by human and natural events such as wars, earthquakes, famine or floods.
Lesson 7: Maths	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> > Mental arithmetic and bar charts 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> > Understand mathematical language and use it to discuss their work and explain their thinking. > Compare their ideas and methods of working with others. > Interpret situations mathematically using appropriate symbols or diagrams. > Present information and results clearly.
Lesson 8: Art	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> > Paper modelling and reflections 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> > Use a range of media, materials, tools and processes such as: drawing, painting, printmaking, malleable materials, textiles and three-dimensional construction, selecting which is appropriate in order to realise personal ideas and intentions.
